

- 22 acres of green space in the city.
- Considered as the green lung of the city.
- 2.74 hectares of bird sanctuary with mangroves.



Heritage value of the site

- First railway station in Ernakulam
- Constructed in 1902 by the Maharaja, HH Rama Raja Varma XV
- British were not interested
- King invested royal money
- Sold properties and gold
- Completed the project Ernakulam Terminus
- 3-4 regular trains with a capacity to carry 200 passengers
- Prominent personalities arrived in the station
- The bird sanctuary was left undisturbed being a marshy area
- Biodiversity of Mangalvanam

Design with Nature Idea

- An important transportation node
- The location was chosen due to its proximity to the Ernakulam market
- Inland water canals connected different parts of the old city
- Boat jetties and ferries next to the station easy movement of people and goods
- Marshy area on one side of the railway property
- The canal connected to backwaters brings saline water in during the high tide
- Mangroves provide shelter to animals, birds and reptiles
- Nesting and breeding place for migratory birds







- New railway stations in the city Ernakulam Terminus lost its glory
- Converted into a goods station and abandoned completely later
- Has some of the colonial structures
- No public access protected area
- Nature took over the site
- Railway planning for new projects in the site
- Might have negative impacts the biodiversity of the area
- High rise buildings near to the bird sanctuary decrease in bird population
